

Impact for Art and Design

At St George's we aim to develop our children's creativity by providing challenges and inspiring them to express their ideas and create their own works of art.

At the end of each year the children will:

- have developed their understanding of a range of different media.
- become self-reflective
- and will be able to evaluate their own work noting where they need to make changes to improve any future work.

Progress in art and design is demonstrated through regular discussions, annotations, and self-assessments. The children's knowledge of key facts and information is shown in their confident decision making when designing their own art works. Their sketchbooks map out their progress and will be a guide through each stage of a project from the initial research stages, into the development stages and then to the finished results. The subject leader monitors through book looks and lesson visits. Formative assessment is recorded over the year using the National Curriculum statements on BROMCOM.

When the children leave St George's they will have knowledge of a range of techniques and be confident to take these skills into their learning at key stage 3 and beyond. They will be able to produce creative work, exploring their ideas and recording their experiences. They will have a good understanding of different design techniques such as painting and sculpture and they will have been exposed to a variety of different artists, crafts makers, and designers.
