Year 2	<u>Movers and Shakers</u> This project teaches children about historically significant people who have had a major impact on the world. They will learn to use timelines, stories and historical sources to find out about the people featured and use historical models to explore their significance.				<u>Magnificent Monarchs</u> This project teaches children about the English and British monarchy from AD 871 to the present day. Using timelines, information about royal palaces, portraits and other historical sources, they build up an understanding of the monarchs and then research six of the most significant sovereigns.	
Year 3				<u>Through the Ages</u> This project teaches children about British prehistory from the Stone Age to the Iron Age, including changes to people and lifestyle caused by ingenuity,	<u>Emperors and Empires</u> This project teaches children about the history and structure of ancient Rome and the Roman Empire, including a detailed exploration of the Romanisation of Britain.

Year 4	<u>Ancient Civilisations</u> This project teaches children about the history of three of the world’s first ancient civilisations: ancient Sumer, ancient Egypt and the Indus Valley civilisation. Children will learn about the rise, life, achievements and eventual end of each civilisation.				<u>Invasion</u> This project teaches children about life in Britain after the Roman withdrawal. Children will learn about the Anglo-Saxon invasion up to the Norman conquest.	<u>Traders and Raiders</u> Develop children’s knowledge of Britain’s early invaders and settlers. Children learn about Viking culture, chronology and key events.
Year 5	<u>Pharaohs</u> This project teaches children about ancient Egypt, life on the Nile, the great pyramids and the powerful rule of the ancient pharaohs.		<u>Ground breaking Greeks</u> This project teaches children about Comparative timelines, evidence from different sources, identify bias and form balanced arguments, Minoan civilisation, comparing Minoans and Mycenaeans, discovering the Dark Age and the Archaic period	<u>Off with her Head!</u> This project develops the children’s knowledge of the Tudor dynasty. Year 6		<u>Britain at War & British Empire</u> This project teaches children about the causes, events and consequences of the First and Second World Wars, the influence of new inventions on warfare, how life in Great Britain was affected and the legacy of the wars in the post-war period.			<u>Children at War</u> This project teaches children about WW2, air raid sirens, spitfires and Britain at war. Pupils learn about why nations are fighting and why children were evacuated to the countryside.
